



Port Consolidated is one of the only inland fuel stations in West Palm Beach that sells 90-octane gas (no ethanol). As of March $22^{\rm nd}$ the price per gallon of 90-octane was \$3.85 9 /₁₀ at this location. Show your WPBFC membership card to receive a 5-cent per gallon discount (if using a credit card a 3% fee applies). Please present your membership card before pumping gas; our contact at the station is **Melinda Gambino**. Port Consolidated's hours of operation are Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The facility is not open on Saturday or Sunday.



The EPA recently authorized the use of E15 gas that can contain up to 15% ethanol. Ethanol reduces engine performance and fuel economy. It also plays havoc with fuel lines, fiberglass fuel tanks and other critical parts. To find a station in other regions that carry 'non-ethanol' fuel go online to www.pure-gas. org. 



Legend Cover Worthy



In case you missed it, lifetime WPBFC member Larry Mullins and his 1949 Rybovich, Legend, were featured on the cover of the January 2011 issue of Southern Boating magazine. Photographer Gary Hilliard (a former Rybovich-Spencer

employee) captured the cover shot. The Legend was among a small fleet of classic Rybovich boats that participated in the Ocean Reef Club's annual Vintage Weekend in North Key Largo last December. "What is truly interesting about going to events like this is not seeing the antique cars or vintage planes and boats, but meeting all the wonderful people. We had the thrill of meeting Tony Accardo's daughter and granddaughter at the event this year," said Mullins. Tony Accardo was the first owner of the boat (originally named *Clari Jo*). If the name Accardo sounds familiar it is because Tony 'Big Tuna' Accardo was the reported boss of the Chicago Outfit criminal organization and worked for the infamous gangster Al Capone in the 1940's. "Tony's daughter, who is now 70 years old, had not set foot on the boat in 62 years." For Mullins, meeting Accardo's daughter has no doubt added a new wrinkle to the already fascinating tale of this classic Rybovich's history. "I continue to have fun and really enjoy this boat," said Mullins.

Club Burgee on the Bow....By the way if you look closely that's the WPBFC burgee flying proudly on the bow of the *Legend*! "I once owned a Forrest Johnson Prowler named *Ono* that was owned by the late Capt. Bill Lance. Bill was an active and longtime club member. He always flew the Fishing Club burgee. In fact the day he caught the winning blue marlin for the club's Beinecke Trophy in 1978 a club burgee was on the bow. So once I got the boat I did not want to break with tradition. I'll always fly the WPBFC burgee on my boats," professed Mullins.


Pavlik at New Post

Rybovich Family Tradition Continues



Club member **Michael Rybovich**, in partnership with friend and longtime Rybovich customer, **Larry Wilson**, has purchased E&H Boat Works in Palm Beach Gardens to launch *Michael Rybovich & Sons Boat Works*. "This is something I have been pursuing since the family yard was sold so many years ago. I'm ready to get to work and take care of the sport fishing customers again," said Michael. With the opening of this new yard, Michael will be continuing a boat repair and boat building legacy that began in 1919 by his grandfather, **John 'Pop' Rybovich**, **Sr**. The Rybovich

name was made famous by brothers **Johnny**, **Tommy** and **Emil** (Michael's dad) after World War II when the trio revolutionized the design of sportfishing boats and innovated features like the transom door, tuna tower and aluminum outriggers. Michael's son **Dusty** will likely join his dad in this new endeavor, bringing a fourth generation family member into the fold. Dusty is a graduate from the prestigious Webb Institute in Glen Cove, NY, with degrees in naval architecture and marine engineering. He is the first Rybovich to be formally trained in naval architecture. "At the moment he is busy teaching English to high school students in Angol, Chile. It is an adventure he had planned for quite some time before graduation. He will eventually join us, I am sure," said Michael. The new yard will be up and running in a limited capacity immediately. Full haul and launch capabilities and a full crew of craftsmen will soon be available. The Waldner Parasite

Here's a unique fish story.... WPBFC member **Dr. Ray Waldner** has the distinction of having a fish parasite named in his honor. A little over thirty years ago Ray was diving off the Dominican Republic with **Dr. Bert Williams**, one of the foremost fish

parasitologists in the Caribbean, and Dr. Williams' wife **Lucy**, head of Biology at the University of Puerto Rico. "We were attending a scientific conference there and decided to look for some parasites since there had been little research done in the region," explained Waldner. During the dive Waldner discovered a harlequin bass carrying an unfamiliar parasite. The fish was collected and as it turns out the attached parasite was a new species that is found only in that particular reef area off the Dominican Republic. Dr. Wil-

liams & his wife Lucy published a paper on the new species and named the critter after Ray, *Renocila waldneri*. Ray's 'fish fame' has manifested itself in many ways in the years since his discovery including an appearance on the Animal Planet's TV series River Monsters titled "Killer Snakeheads" where he was a featured scientific expert.

Waldner, professor of biology at Palm Beach Atlantic University and adjunct professor of zoology at Florida Atlantic University, continues to be the Fishing Club's 'go to guy' when it comes to fish identification. The Fishing Club has consulted with Dr. Ray for many years on fishery resource matters, and continues to do so. Thank you Ray for your valuable input and 26 years of membership support!

Jolley Appointed to HMS AP




West Palm Beach Fishing Club board member and scientific advisor **John Jolley** of Boynton Beach has been

appointed to the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) Atlantic Highly Migratory Species (HMS) Advisory Panel. The HMS Advisory Panel advises NMFS on the collection and evaluation of information for developing or amending fishery management plans for highly migratory species of fish like tuna and billfish. Jolley is a former senior fishery biologist with Florida's old Department of Natural Resources (now the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission) and has been an active recreational angler his entire life. John will be representing the recreational sector on the advisory panel. "John brings a broad breadth of experience to the advisory panel. His long history of scientific inquiry and recreational fishing will be very valuable to this panel. We're glad he finally retired so he can start doing more of this kind of stuff," said fellow WPBFC board member Chester Brewer who also serves as chairman of the Coastal Conservation Association Government Relations Committee and as a recreational fishing advisor to the U.S. delegation of the International Commission for the Conservation of Atlantic Tunas. Jolley follows in the footsteps of Fishing Club member Jim Williams of North Palm Beach who served on the HMS advisory panel the past several years.

Club Record Book Updated



A recently updated version of the WPBFC All Time Club Record Book has been published and distributed to current members. This latest edition features nearly two-dozen pictures of some of the existing record catches. All the

members need to know to be eligible for submitting potential record catches are also outlined in the book. Club members are encouraged to keep a copy of the record book in their tackle bag (with their certified hand scale) or on their boat so that when a notable catch is made you can see if it is a pending club record. Additional copies of the record book are available at the clubhouse. All time club records, as well as Big Fish of the Year standings, are also listed and regularly updated on the club website at www. westpalmbeachfishingclub.org and on the All Time Club Record Board inside the clubhouse.



ANDE Earns #1 Again!

The International Game Fish Association (IGFA) recently announced that

ANDE is the "#1 Line in the World for 2010". Each calendar vear the IGFA tallies information such as what type of tackle and fishing line was used for each world record that was approved. Notably, this is the ninth year in a row that ANDE has earned the prestigious honor. In fact, ANDE is the only fishing line ever voted #1 for fresh water and salt water. Last year ANDE fishing line was used to set a total of 184 new world records. These additions to the IGFA world record book give ANDE an impressive 2,334 current world records. ANDE currently holds records in all line categories, including 1,395 for salt water, 422 for fresh water and 517 fly tippet world records. Congratulations to our friends at ANDE.....the line of champions!



2010 Annual Trophy Winners Honored

The awarding of annual club angling trophies is one of the great traditions at the West Palm Beach Fishing Club. We are thrilled to recognize our 2010 winners.

Club member Tim Givens of Palm Beach won the Beinecke Atlantic Blue Marlin Release Trophy with a fish he released in the Bahamas early last year while fishing offshore White Sand Ridge. The Beinecke Trophy is presented in memory of Mr. & Mrs. **Richard S. Beinecke** and has been presented by the Fishing Club for over 50 years.

William Schmitt (age 15) of West Palm Beach won the James P. Nora Award

for the largest snook caught last year. Will caught, weighed and released a 31 lb. snook while fishing at

Palm Beach Inlet. He is one of the youngest recipients of the club's top snook award, a notable angling achievement considering the Nora Award has been presented by the Fishing Club since 1964.

Lifetime WPBFC member Mark Wodlinger of Tequesta earned the Tracy Schneider Memorial Sailfish Release Trophy. The Schneider Trophy competition was hotly contested last year with numerous club members posting impressive release numbers including Carl Weigold (then 15 years old) of Boca Raton with 68 releases and Rob Lane of Boonton Township, New Jersey, with 40 releases. But it was Wodlinger who earned top sailfish honors with a total of 90 releases during the 2010 calendar year, releasing 68 on live bait and 22 on dead bait to equal 13,400 points. It is the third highest point total ever scored by a club member since the award's inception in 1994. Nick Smith of Stuart claimed the Fishing Club's Donald S. Leas III International Angling Trophy. Smith posted incredible billfish release numbers last year that are

> not likely to be duplicated anytime soon. Nick released 120 Pacific sailfish in Guatemala, 103 striped marlin in Magdalena Bay, Mexico, and 2 blue marlin in Guatemala during the calendar year. All billfish were caught and released on fly fishing tackle with 20-pound IGFA class tippets.

No club members qualified for the Richard Jeck Memorial Billfish Tagging Trophy. A minimum of 20 tagged billfish are required. Notably, club member Mark Wodlinger tagged 19 sailfish last year, falling just one fish shy of the trophy requirement. Congratulations all award winners!


Walsh Reps In Redbone

A Palm Beach **Marlin Tale**

> his fish story took place Monday, January 31st. My fishing buddy Don Gilman and I left the dock from the Palm Beach Yacht Club after being told by the dock master that there were marlin 20 miles offshore. Well, my 34' single diesel engine Albin would take

forever to make that round trip. Listening to the VHF radio we heard that nothing was being caught near shore. After running through lots of weeds, we headed off shore with hopes of finding a school of dolphin. I then deployed three attractor rigs that I had modified, one resembling a school of bait fish, another a sailfish attacking squid, and finally a third that looked like two bonitos thrashing about at the transom of the boat. We set out six lines offering different presentations of poppers, plain and skirted ballyhoo to make up the final spread. Now, we were ready. Over the years I have discovered the real trick in bringing fish to the boat is deploying a sound that attracts them. Playing Pavorotti is a sound that fish cannot resist. Maybe Pavorotti sounds like fish mating, or a soliciting call – whatever it is, it works.

At noon our rigged ballyhoo on a number eight j-hook snapped out of the left outrigger. We were in 750 feet of water off of Lost Tree. Don grabbed the rod while the fish was taking line off the spool at a rapid pace. I put the boat in reverse and used the bow thrusters to keep the fish directly behind us. I had to reverse the boat so that Don could get some line back on the reel. The battle ensued. Each time we brought the fish closer to the stern of the boat it ran off at high speed without us being able to get a look at what we were up against. Don commented that the fish was probably a large shark because it kept diving deep and had not jumped. Don shook his rod arm every now and then to release the muscle fatigue as he was fighting the unknown monster while standing with only a rod belt around his waist. He was fishing with only 30 lb. monofilament line and a 40 lb. fluorocarbon leader.

With the line going straight down deep behind the boat we finally saw a fish leap out of the water 120 yards away. "Wow!", Don yelled, "it's a marlin!" Fifteen minutes later, the marlin skyrocketed again all the way out of the water. It was an unbelievable sight! It was twice the size of the one my wife and I caught off of Palm Beach several years ago. An hour later, after backing the boat up over 3 miles, we finally got the marlin close to the transom. With the leader now on the reel, the big billfish shook his head violently three times throwing the hook. "Great", I said, "it's a Palm Beach release without hurting the

fish". The marlin still had a lot of fight left in him.

> While dripping wet with perspiration, Don said, "it took me 54

years to finally do this" ... "I certainly do not need to go the gym and lift weights today!" After all the excitement, we called it a day and headed back to the dock. Everyone asked if we got a photo. The answer was no. Every time I tried to leave the helm to grab the long gaff in hopes of a tuna or to get the camera, Don would shout for me to turn the boat. We had to keep the marlin, which kept racing back and forth, directly off the stern of the boat or we would have lost the fish. Don and I have an indelible picture in our heads of that spectacular Palm Beach marlin leaping out of the water. My guess, is that the fish weighed around 400 pounds. This magnificent marlin gave us some truly thrilling and memorable moments. Captain Tore Turney on the VHF said, "Congratulations! Are you going to write a story about it?" "Well, yes", I said. The next day, Don sent me a text message saying, "I hope the marlin is as sore as I am!"



New junior member Mike Lybass (age 15) from Glastonbury, CT, had a memorable first trip to Guatemala earlier this year. Mike caught & released an estimated

Sailfish Derby Breaks Records...Again!

reaking records is starting to sound like (pardon the pun) a broken record with the West Palm Beach Fishing Club's annual Silver Sailfish Derby. This year the tournament fleet of 35 boats tallied an incredible 677 sailfish releases January 6th through 8th. The three-day catch average of 6.45 sailfish per boat eclipsed the tournament's previous catch average record of 6.39 set during the 2006 Derby when 50 boats released 958 sailfish. The numbers don't have much meaning until you consider

that the *Derby's* historical average in the 74-year old event is around 1.4 sailfish per boat day.

This year's *Derby* began with a soggy, but productive first day. A passing cold front brought driving rains and strong winds from the west prompting small craft warnings. Despite the 'un-Chamber of Commerce—like' conditions the fleet managed to catch 174 sailfish. The best of the action was the area between Stuart Inlet and the Hutchinson Island power plant. The action moved progressively south the following two days and cool westerly winds continued to stoke an already hot sailfish bite.



Team Murray of West Palm Beach posted the single best day of this year's tournament, catching 19 sailfish on the *Derby's* second day. That day was also another Derby record breaker with a single day per boat catch average of 8.2 sailfish. On day two the fleet released a total of 287 sailfish. "We had very little time to catch our breath. For a three hour period the tournament radio committee was logging a sailfish release nearly every minute," commented Derby radioman and Fishing Club chairman

Pete Schulz of Fishing Headquarters in Jupiter. The action did not slow on the *Derby's* final day (which is two hours shorter than the first two). A total of 216 sailfish were released.

Team Get Lit with Capt. Quinton Dierterle at the helm earned top boat honors in this years Derby with 37 sailfish releases. "We had a blast fishing the Derby again this year. It really is one of our

favorite events and we appreciate being included. The *Derby* committee does a remarkable job of putting on a tournament that is current, but at the same time, reflective of the rich history of both the Fishing Club and the *Silver Sailfish Derby*. It really is an honor for us to see our names in the history books of such a prestigious event," said angler **Kitt Toomey**.

Get Lit angler **Peter Miller** of Pinecrest, Florida, won the prestigious Mrs. Henry Rea Trophy for the most individual releases with 18 sailfish. Miller edged out West Palm Beach angler **Heather Murray** aboard Team Murray who had 17 individual releases. **Scott Robins** of Miami Beach aboard Weez In The Keys placed third individually with 16 releases. **Tom Craig** of Jupiter fishing aboard the Big Whoop took fourth place individually with 15 releases.

Second place team overall Weez In The Keys lead by Capt. Ray Rosher of Miami scored 34 sailfish releases. Team Murray with family members Mike, Rob and Heather Murray finished third overall with 33 releases. The Ft. Lauderdale based team Barefoot placed fourth overall on time with 30 releases. Barefoot angler Justin Lord earned





the Louis S. Boski Trophy for the Derby's most outstanding catch by landing a 42-pound wahoo using a light mono leader and single circle hook. The heaviest weight fish of the tournament was a 44-pound cobia landed by Adam Yunis of Coral Gables aboard the MD 20-20. A total of 71 sailfish

were tagged with Billfish Foundation nylon dart tags by tournament anglers this year. The top tag team was Team Murray with 23 tagged sails.

"Thank you to the Fishing Club for such a great tournament. The Derby crew always makes it a special event. Being involved in this tournament for about the past 15 years has always been the highlight of my angling year, and this year certainly did not disappoint. We are looking forward to the 75th anniversary tournament!" said Bonnie Carpenter who fished aboard the *Xipias*.








Drift Boat Memories


About fifty years ago **Doug Peterson** was a young high school boy growing up in West Palm Beach earning his spending money by working on the Blue Seas drift boat berthed at the Riviera Beach Marina. There were actually three boats in the Blue Seas fleet. The Big Day II and Blue Seas II were located at the aforementioned marina at 13th Street in Riviera Beach and the *Blue Sea I* was berthed at Layton's Trailer Park, also in Riviera Beach. Captain **Ted Brower** and his wife **Mary** owned the boats. Ted usually ran one of the boats and Mary collected the money.

"You could go out in the morning for \$5 bucks and I think the afternoon trip was \$4," recalled Peterson during a recent visit to the West Palm Beach Fishing Club. Nearly a dozen other drift boats dotted the Palm Beach County coastline in the 1960's. There was a reliable demand for affordable trips offshore. "We had quite a few seasonal residents who would come to Riviera Beach each winter just to fish on our boat. They would supplement their income by selling their catch each day. Back then you didn't need all the licenses and permits you need today. I sold fish too when I could. We'd take them

to Hudgins Fish House and get 4 or 6 cents a pound for kingfish. Snapper were 35 cents a pound and grouper were 25 cents. Things have changed some!" laughed Peterson.

A half-day trip generally resulted in about a dozen muttons, two to three dozen yellowtails, quite a few porgies and grunts and a few grouper. "It was pretty much guaranteed that you were gonna come home with something. Always muttons and yellowtails, and if the kings were running we'd get plenty of kings." Smoker kings were common in the summer months. The biggest king Peterson ever caught weighed 64 pounds. "We never kept any of the toros, triggerfish, blue runners and grunts. There were too many good fish to keep. We also didn't go south very often because the triggerfish would eat you out of house and home." According to Peterson there were some exceptions to that rule, especially in the summer on days when the tide was not roaring to the north. "We used to catch genuine red snapper in 180 to 240 feet off the Breaker's. Four to eight pounders mostly. We'd also catch rose perch and yelloweye snapper there too. But most of the time the current was too strong to fish that deep," said Peterson. While most of the trips aboard the Blue Seas took place just outside Palm Beach Inlet, there were occasions when the boat would run farther north. "We would fish the peaks in 180 feet just south of Jupiter Inlet sometimes when the current was light. You could probably only fish that spot 4 or 5 days a year because the tide had to be just right. The peaks were huge, but it was a small area so you had to





make the drift just right. We would catch Warsaw grouper, tilefish and sea bass there on guppy rigs. We caught double-header groupers that were 20 to 30 pounds each sometimes. The boat even caught a 90 pound swordfish there one day." Some locally based drift boats would run even farther north. The old Catch A Lot based out of the West Palm Beach Municipal Marina was among them. It was a fast, narrow beamed wooden boat that would sometimes run to the humps off Stuart to catch Warsaw, tilefish and sea bass in the

late 1960's. "One day I saw that boat get buried coming in Palm Beach Inlet when there was about an 18 foot ground sea. The bow of the boat got stuffed in the backside of one of the waves and water was all the way up to the wheelhouse. We thought they were going to run into the jetty, but it popped back up like a cork and they got in safely."

When asked about his most memorable drift boat trip ever. Peterson recalled a half-day excursion in the late 1960's. "We were right out in front of Palm Beach Inlet in 96 feet of water. Everything was biting and it was absolutely non-stop action from the moment we dropped the lines. We caught dozens of muttons and about 18 big gray and black groupers. Even the people who were not very good with a rod were catching fish. We never had another trip where we caught bottom fish like that again," remembered Peterson. Sardines have become the bait of choice on the drift boats of today, but fifty years ago the preferred bait was ballyhoo. "We used strictly ballyhoo for bait because the local commercial guys were seine netting them off the beach. The sardines came later." Penn 4/0 and 6/0 reels were used. The terminal rigs have basically remained unchanged; triple hook rigs, mono leaders and about 1 to 2 ounces of lead. "We'd rig the tourists with a short leader, that way they wouldn't get snagged. Most of the time they didn't know when they hit bottom. The regulars would get the fifteen foot leaders."

Peterson remembers plenty of memorable kingfish trips. "Sometimes we'd have 49 people on the boat, our


limit, and we'd have to come in early because we ran out of places to put the fish; we boated hundreds of kingfish on a half-day trip. One time I caught 36 kings myself during a half-day using a Penn spinning outfit and a Tony Accetta jig. Sometimes we'd run way north or south and then circle back to where the school was, just to eat up some time and give us a break; that way we didn't have to constantly bait hooks, land fish and make rigs. On one night trip we were catching the kings so fast we needed a break so the captain ran a few miles north and out into deep water, but the kings were still there. That school of fish must have stretched for miles. We couldn't get away from them. We didn't catch very many fish under 20 pounds that night and we had some that were over 60 pounds," said Peterson. "We finally discovered that we could make more money boxing the kingfish at local fish houses rather than catching and selling them ourselves." Peterson frequented places like Simmons Fish House (where the old Crab Pot Restaurant once stood at the foot of the Blue Heron Bridge, now the location of Loggerhead Club & Marina) and Acme Fish House on 22nd Street in Riviera Beach. "Back then it was not uncommon to see 6 or 8 jewfish hung up in Simmons Fish House that had been sold by spear fishermen." A lot has changed since Doug Peterson's days on the Blue Seas drift boats. The fish houses are all gone, by comparison keeper grouper catches on local drift boats are a rarity and only a handful of traditional party boats remain. In his retirement Peterson became a commercial kingfish bug-

ger. "I just sold my boat. It's gotten to be too much of a hassle and expense with all the federal regulations. A commercial kingfish permit, if you can find one, is about \$3,500. snapper-grouper permit costs \$20,000



to get both. Seeing kingfish steaks from Indonesia in Wal-Mart for \$8.99 a pound was the icing on the cake. That was it for me."

Editors Note: Doug Peterson now lives in Boynton Beach. He thinks that Mary Brower may have made him and other drift boat mates members of the West Palm Beach Fishing Club (WPBFC) at one time. He does recall attending past Fishing Club awards banquets run by the late Frances Doucet. Peterson recently donated some old fishing memorabilia items to the WPBFC archives.



Swords That Shook the World

Recreational fishing for broadbill swordfish off southeast Florida was essentially non-existent throughout much of the 20th century. While impressive catches were made in other locales in the Pacific and in the western north Atlantic off Nova Scotia and New England, successfully targeting swords off south Florida was basically unheard of...that is until one memorable July evening off Miami in 1976. "These were the two fish that shook the angling world," recalled longtime WPBFC member Capt. Bouncer Smith of Miami. "Up until these two fish were caught there was no recreational swordfish fishery in our area, just a small commercial fishery comprised of a tight knit group of exiled Cuban

fishermen." Bouncer recently donated a picture for the WPBFC archives of anglers Jesse Webb (also a longtime WPBFC member) and Jerry Webb (Jesse's cousin) with their groundbreaking swordfish catch. Jesse's fish weighed 388.5 lbs. and Jerry's tipped the scales at approximately 350 lbs. The anglers were fishing aboard the Sea Boots II with Capt. Mike Carey and mate Bill Harrison. As the

story goes Jesse learned of an incidental swordfish landing from a Miami headboat that was a potential record in South Florida Metropolitan Fishing Tournament (MET). Jesse was a MET board member and was assigned to verify the unusual catch. "It seemed interesting to me that nobody else had caught one, so I started calling around and was eventually referred to a few biologists, one in Cape Cod and one on Long Island. They gave me some very useful information on swordfish behavior and feeding habits. So I started nosing around in Miami and that's when I decided we should try to go and catch one," recalled Jesse Webb who recently celebrated his 91st birthday and calls himself "The luckiest man alive." On Jesse and Jerry's first attempt they

got stripped on 50 lb. class tackle. They upgraded to 80 lb. class tackle on their next try and landed the two fish pictured. They were back at the dock by about 2:30 a.m. "I remember telephoning someone to come down to the fish house to weigh our fish and they thought I had gone crazy for calling them in the middle of the night with such an unbelievable fish story," said Jesse.

As so often occurs in the angling world, news of the catch spread quickly. Soon recreational anglers were landing swords with regularity. Swordfish tournaments took root in Miami and Ft. Lauderdale. Commercial longline fleets, some from as far away as Japan, followed. Within in several years' biological warning signs, such as a 50 percent reduction in the average weight of fish landed and declining catch rates, began to reveal trouble. By the mid-1980's, the robust fishery that Jesse and Jerry discovered had dramatically declined. Fortunately, through strict international and federal regulations, the swordfish fishery has rebounded to the point where they are no longer considered overfished. However, the importance of the Florida Straits as a swordfish nursery ground and vastly improved angling gear and techniques requires resource managers to remain vigilant. For now, a sustainable recreational and commercial buoy fishery appears to be in place...and anyone who goes searching for swordfish off southeast Florida these days can thank Jesse & Jerry Webb for leading the way.

Report Your Swordfish Landings

Anglers are reminded to report all non-tournament landings of North Atlantic swordfish, including those landed on a charter/headboat, to NOAA Fisheries online at www.hmspermits.gov or by calling 1-800-894-5528 within 24 hours of the landing. Reporting your catch plays an important role in maintaining current swordfish quotas for the United States.

58 Sails in One Day

This was the Forecast: Cold front **⊥** pushing through overnight, winds north-northwest 13-18 knots, lows in the low 40's with wind chill in the 30's. "Looks like a good day to try and see if the sails are biting," famous words made by **Jimmy Lambert** on January 11th. The following morning the weather service prediction was right on and it was bone cold! As we pushed out Hillsboro Inlet at 8:30 a.m. and pointed north the wind chill at 13-18 knots was multiplied by the millionth power. We were running straight into it at 50 miles per hour in a center console boat. We ran to our favorite spot, the 'Martini Glass' off Boynton Beach. With a little bit of west in the wind we knew we would be blown slowly offshore, so we set up in 100 foot of water. Just as I was getting my offshore kite in the air Jimmy yells out "Got him on!" What a great way to start the day! First bait in the water and we connect with a sailfish, our intended target. Not to waste anytime Joe Figiel and I continued to put our kites out. Just as we got the spread completely out the sails started to show up in packs. The single turned into a guad and that is the way it continued. As I would stare at my kite bait, I would occasionally look up sea and catch a glimpse of multiple

sails swimming down sea. If a flat line would get a bite, it was only a matter of time before they would show up on one of our kite baits. This same pattern continued all day. The majority of the bites were between 100-125 feet from the Martini Glass to Boynton Inlet. As the day progressed there were no boats to be seen and we all

began to call all our friends and fishermen that we knew to come out and join us. Every person we called were either in a tournament to the north or preparing for one the following day. So we continued to fish all alone. The only boat seen all day was a Coast Guard Cutter. As word got out about the day we were having we all began to get calls and text messages from people seeking updates. By mid-afternoon we were up to 41 releases and they were still biting. As cold as it was, we never felt it. We fought multiples all day long. The most we had on at one time was 7 sailfish. I can't say how many times we had 5 sailfish on at once, but with only 5 anglers it kept us really busy. As the day progressed we started recycling baits. By the end of the day we had our last 4 wounded baits out on the kites, maybe missing an eye, a small cut, or just worn out! Those last baits struggled and kicked with



every little bit they had. One by one they got ate until we hooked and successfully landed our last quad for the day. When the final tally was counted we ended up with 58 sailfish releases for 85 bites. It was one incredible day of fishing right out of our back yard.

Editors Note: This is one of the best sailfish release days recorded in recent history off the Palm Beaches. The record one day catch was set on February 3rd, 1980 by the late Lou Boski and crew fishing aboard the Elbow 7 with Capt. Albert Johnson at the helm. They released an amazing 83 sails, ironically in the same general area east of Boynton Inlet. Longtime Fishing Club member Capt. Jackie Morrow aboard the No Problem was also on the water that day, his crew released 54 sails.

Another 'Old Reliable' Record

Several years ago Nick Smith's Old Reliable crew became the first to release 100 striped marlin on fly tackle in one season. They were fishing the famed waters of Magdalena Bay, off the western coast of Mexico's Baja peninsula located approximately 140 miles north of Cabo San Lucas. Last fall the crew, Captain Chip Shafer, angler/owner Nick Smith and mates Greysel Moreno and 'Berto' Estrella Puc. entered the record books once again for successfully catching


and releasing 16 striped marlin on fly in one day. All marlin were caught in accordance with IGFA rules using Cam




Sigler flies tied to 20 lb. class tippets. The marlin averaged 100 pounds with several fish in the 125-150 pound class. Nearly all the marlin were raised while blind trolling hookless teasers, mostly Moldcraft and Ilander lures. "I never thought it would be possible to catch that many in a single day on fly. Given the stripes' tendency to not tease in well, and then for their long, drawn out battles once hooked. They're tough to catch in big numbers,"

commented Smith who has been a WPBFC member for 58 years. Congratulations Nick!






Hobe Sound Outing 2011

The day could not have been any better. The weather was fantastic this year.




I watched as they talked to boaters, parlaying information regarding safe boating classes, being friendly, yet tactful, asking one boater to move his boat while he attempted repairs.

Even though I don't fish the outing this event always proves to be quite entertaining....thank you to all for participating, the camaraderie and sharing your great fish stories!









Scholarship Awarded

More Mooring Buoys...

The PBCFF board of directors has approved a \$2,600 contribution to support expansion of the county's mooring buoy program. The money will be part of local matching dollars needed for an FWC Florida Boating Improvement grant. Buoys will be added to the popular Breaker's Reef site, the Pep Reef off Mar-a-Lago and at a near shore reef off Boca Raton. Mooring buoys prevent the need to anchor when fishing or snorkeling. They have been used with great success in other regions to protect coral and other sensitive benthic habitat. Pending grant approval from the FWC the new buoys will be installed this summer.

There are many boating safety courses and schools throughout south Florida that offer very intense training, many of which lead to the issuance of a Coast Guard Captain's license. Naturally, there are numerous publications on the topic. The Coast Guard publishes the "Rules of the Road" and every boater should own and have read a copy. Keep one at home and the other on the boat. This publication spells out the boating safety rules and gives excellent examples of each. This booklet is the navigational and safety Bible. Read it-know it.

Additionally, the Coast Guard puts out other publications on how to safely and appropriately outfit your boat with the necessary safety gear and equipment. At the very least, you should have the correct amount and type of life vests and floatation devices. A VHF and back up are a must. Fire extinguisher and flares should also be on board. Don't forget a top-flight first aid kit either. These items should be checked every six months to make sure they are fresh and operational.

Every boat owner with children should get the kids involved early. As a parent, your kids look up to you and you make a standing impression with your actions. If you are a conscientious boater and you share your skills with them, odds are they too will be safe on the water. Especially nowadays with the advent of wakeboards, we have a lot of younger boaters out on the water, many unsupervised. Leading by example is the best impression you can make on the youth.

Boating is fun and can lead to many valuable experiences and memories for the whole family. If you are a safe boater, your memories will be excellent. If you disregard the rules and tenets of safety, you are increasing the odds that your memories will indeed be nightmares.

Remember, we all share these wonderful resources and must care for them collectively, be safe, be respectful of your fellow boater and the environment.


Twyford Inducted into Sports Hall of Fame

Reef Brochure Updated

In the 1960's under the leadership of then club president Johnny Rybovich the West Palm Beach Fishing Club developed Florida's first officially permitted artificial reef. The reef, which was created by sinking dozens of scrap automobiles, was located off Palm Beach, The old cars have long since eroded away, but the county's reef building program is as

solid as ever. Constructing artificial reef habitat has come a long way in 50 years. Materials like limestone boulders and concrete rubble are now commonly used providing a more suitable and lasting foundation to promote natural marine growth. Today Palm Beach County's Department of Environmental Resources Management (ERM) coordinates the Artificial Reef and Estuarine Enhancement Program. It is one of the most productive and efficient programs of its kind in the country. ERM recently published an updated version of their artificial reef brochure that includes GPS coordinates for reef sites from Jupiter to Boca Raton, including the West Palm Beach Fishing Club Reef and the John Rybovich Endowment Reef. Eagle Claw Reef Kits



If you've been to a WPBFC meeting lately then you may have noticed the addition of Lazer Tools Saltwater Reef Kits in our monthly raffles, maybe you have even won one! Tools in the Saltwater Reef Kit help reduce bycatch and release mortality of reef dwelling fish like snapper and grouper. The venting tool in particular will be helpful to anyone who catches undersized mutton snapper in our region while drift fishing. Venting the inflated air bladder of reef fish before their release increases their likelihood of swimming back down the water column and survival. The Reef Kits conform with

all NOAA regulations, including Amendment 27/14 which requires the use of non-stainless steel circle hooks when using natural baits, and also requires the use of venting tools and de-hooking devices when participating in all commercial and recreational reef fisheries in the Gulf of Mexico. The kit (model SWREEFKIT) contains a dehooker, venting tool, and 3 Lazer Sharp L2004-6/0 nonoffset circle hooks (The same style hook used exclusively by anglers in the club's annual Silver Sailfish Derby). The Reef Kit is the first of its kind to offer the correct and approved style hook and the tools needed to comply with all regulations in one convenient purchase. 
Club Cookbook **Being Considered**
